



Cahir Sensory Garden

The Sensory Garden is located just a short walk from the centre of Cahir town and is a hidden gem. Located on Church Street beside St. Paul's Church, the garden is a wonderful quiet space to unwind, enjoy a picnic, or relax in the sunshine. This sensory garden is an environment that is designed with the purpose of stimulating the senses. This stimulation occurs courtesy of plants and the use of materials that engage one's senses of sight, smell, touch, taste, and sound. These types of gardens are popular with and beneficial to both children and adults, especially those who have sensory processing issues, including autism and other disabilities.

The Sensory Garden is open daily 9am-7pm during the summer months but closes at 4pm in the winter months. It is free of charge to use.

Travelling through Dublin Airport

Many individuals with autism can find travelling through the airport a very difficult and scary experience. For many individuals it represents a new experience which is difficult to understand and sometimes very frightening. Below are a number of simple strategies that can be employed to help the individual with ASD to understand the process of getting through the airport.

Sensory Room and where is it?

A purpose-built sensory room is available for passengers involved

with our special assistance programme and is and open 24 hours a day. It is located after security screening in Terminal 2 and just before the 400 boarding gates. It can be also be accessed via Terminal 1.

'Important Flyer' wristband/lanyard

Dublin Airport can provide a wristband or lanyard for travelling through Dublin Airport. It can be shown to any Dublin Airport staff member (Customer Care and Security screening for example) if assistance is required at security, passport control or any area where you may encounter queues or crowds.
